# The Ins & Outs

The Willmar Fire Department is a paid-on-call department. Each member is issued an alert pager that notifies them when the department is needed for service. Firefighters are paid an hourly rate at 1-hour increments for fire calls and training.

The average years of service on the Willmar Fire Department is 14.12 years.

Rescue and Hazardous Materials services are provided by the department along with fire protection. The Technical Rescue Team (TRT) is compiled of 8 Willmar firefighters and individuals from the Willmar Ambulance and Kandiyohi County Rescue Squad. 5 Willmar firefighters, along with members from 7 other agencies form The Hazardous Materials Emergency Assistance Team (HEAT).

# 2006 Events

## **Pancake Feed**

Each year the Willmar Firefighters' Association hosts an annual pancake feed during the Willmar Fests celebration.

## **National Night Out**

The Willmar Fire Department participated in *National Night Out* on August 1<sup>st</sup> at Robbin's Island. We worked together with the Willmar Police Department, Kandiyohi County Rescue Squad, Willmar Ambulance and several other agencies. Firefighters conducted pumping demos and used a fire safety house to teach fire escape tactics.

## **Story Time at the Fire Station**

On October 3<sup>rd</sup>, the fire department worked together with Willmar Early Childhood Coalition and the Police Department to host *Story Time at the Fire Station*. This event brought in over 700 children and their families for a meal, story, fire safety presentation and a visit by Sparky the fire dog. The book, *Tito the Firefighter* was read by Willmar firefighters in both English and Spanish. This proved to be a triumphant outreach to the Latino population. The organizations involved have expressed their desires to conduct a similar event in 2007.

## **Fire Prevention Week Open House**

Each year during Fire Prevention Week the fire department hosts an open house. On October 10<sup>th</sup>, the community was given the opportunity to visit the fire station and learn about the fire trucks and fire safety. This continues to be a fun and worth-while event for children and adults alike.

# The Fire Chief

The Willmar Fire Chief / Fire Marshal is a full-time position whose immediate supervisor is the City Administrator. The Chief has a variety of responsibilities, some of which include:

- Oversee the day to day operations of the Fire Department, full-time staff and firefighters
- Direct firefighters at the scene of fires and other emergencies
- Create and manage the department budget
- Coordinate the City's emergency management plan
- Ensure the department and firefighters are in compliance with NFPA (National Fire Protection Association) and OSHA (Occupational Safety and Health Association) standards
- Conduct fire investigations
- Assist law enforcement officials with arson investigations
- Enforce the International Fire Code within the community and issue corrective orders
- Assist City staff and citizens with Fire Code concerns
- Conduct day/foster care and commercial inspections
- Enforce Fire Code requirements and assist with building inspections for new construction and remodels
- Inspect and test fire alarm and sprinkler systems within the community
- Determine City water flow

# The Officers

The Willmar Fire Department Officers are appointed for 3-year terms by the Officer Selection Committee. The City Administrator provides final approval for each new appointment.

Officer positions require additional training compared to the firefighter positions as they may assume the role of safety officer or incident command during emergencies. Each truck responding to an incident must contain an Officer prior to departure.

They also assist the Fire Chief with day-to-day operations and help to keep the department running smoothly by providing an effective chain of command and disciplinary procedures. Budget preparation, incident data entry, pre-plan preparation and presentation, public education and departmental operations assistance are a few of their responsibilities.

# The Quotas

# Department Training

Full-department training is generally conducted the first three Thursdays each month. Firefighters work on a variety of subjects including CPR/First Aid, driving, search & rescue, ventilation techniques, pipeline safety, and several others.

During 2006, the department focused much of their attention on the National Incident Management System (NIMS) and fire apparatus operator training.

NIMS is a Federally-mandated program designed to teach standardized incident command procedures to emergency responders nationwide.

Members of the Willmar Fire Department received 40 hours of fire apparatus operator training thanks to the Assistance to Firefighters Grant awarded by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). The course was followed by a State certification test administered by Minnesota Fire Service Certification Board. Those who successfully completed the exam are now certified Apparatus Operators.

Firefighters are given the opportunity to attend outside training classes. These are offered during the many Minnesota State Fire/EMS/Rescue Schools conducted by community and technical colleges throughout the year. This also allows the firefighters to meet their 12-hour school requirement placed on them every 3 years.

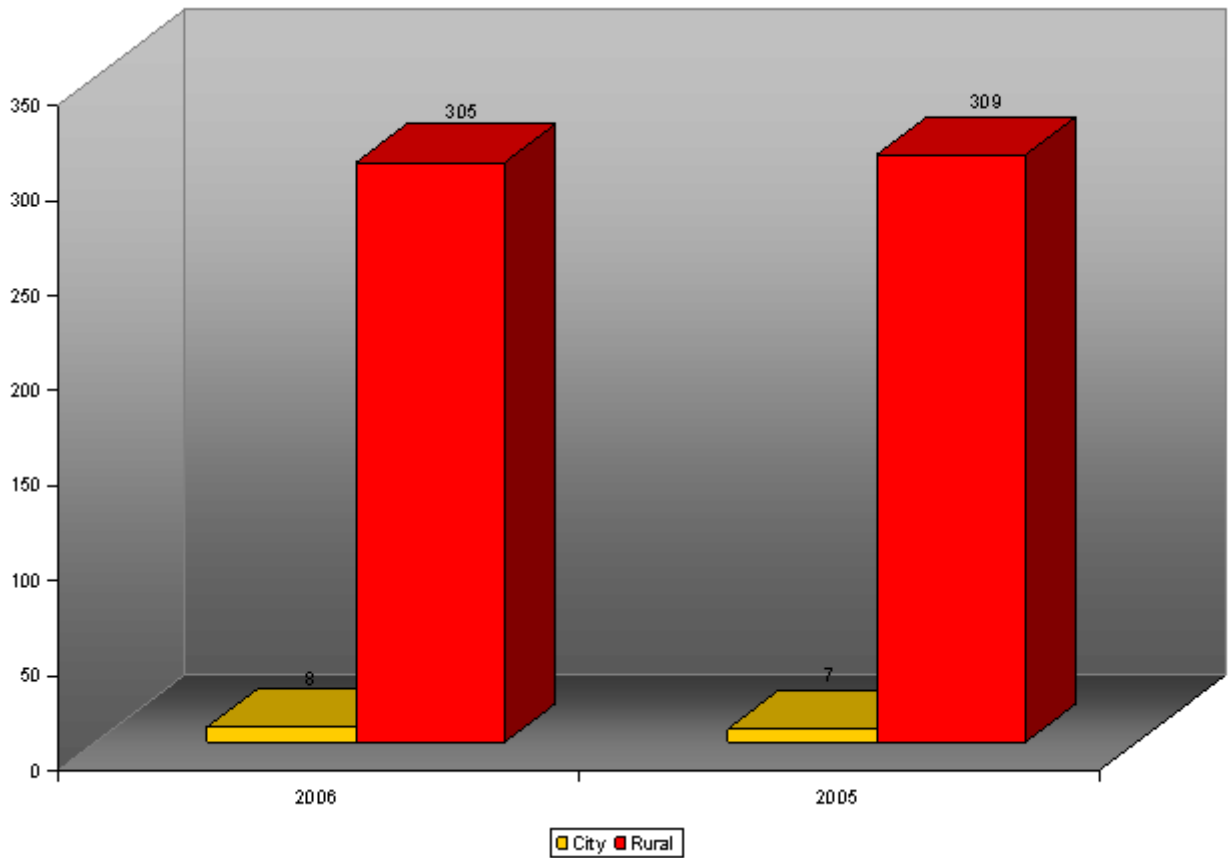

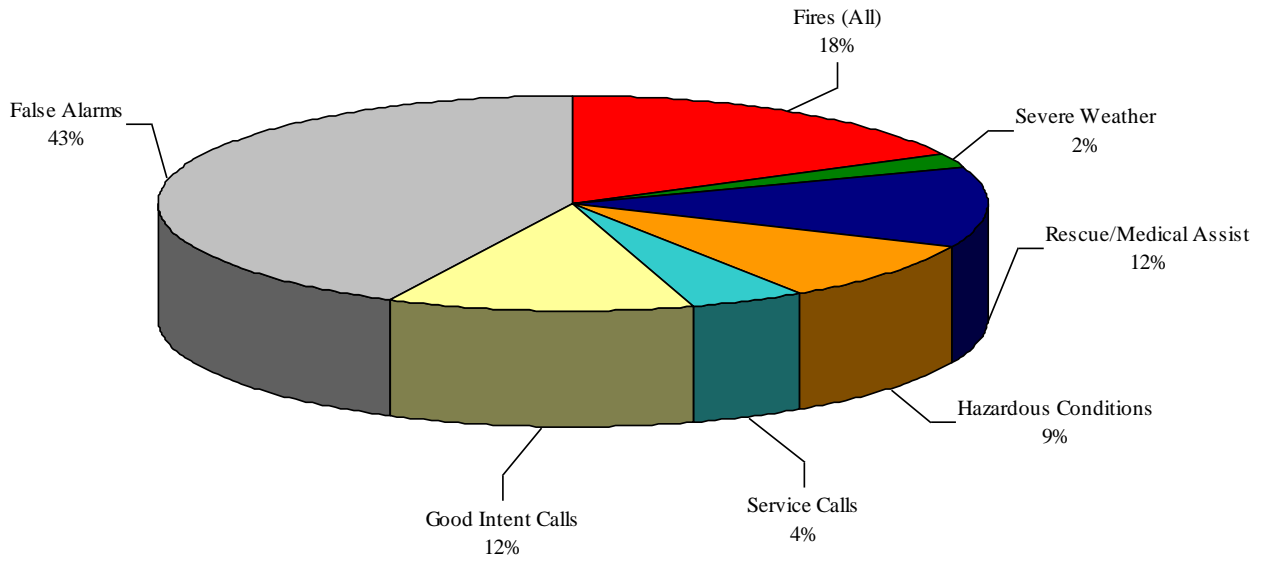
# 2006 False Alarms

Approximately one-third of our calls end up as false alarms, which is good news. The Willmar Fire Department allows 5 false alarms at each address per year (July 1 through June 30). Each additional false alarm costs the venue \$250.

Many false alarms are caused by faulty alarm panels and/or sprinkler systems. Often times, contractors and/or maintenance workers may cause an alarm to activate due to dust or smoke emissions. We do, however, experience several malicious false alarms each year. These are often handled by the Fire Chief with assistance from the Willmar Police Department.

The year 2006 brought 134 false alarms, with 5 being billed and 5 suspected of being malicious alarms.

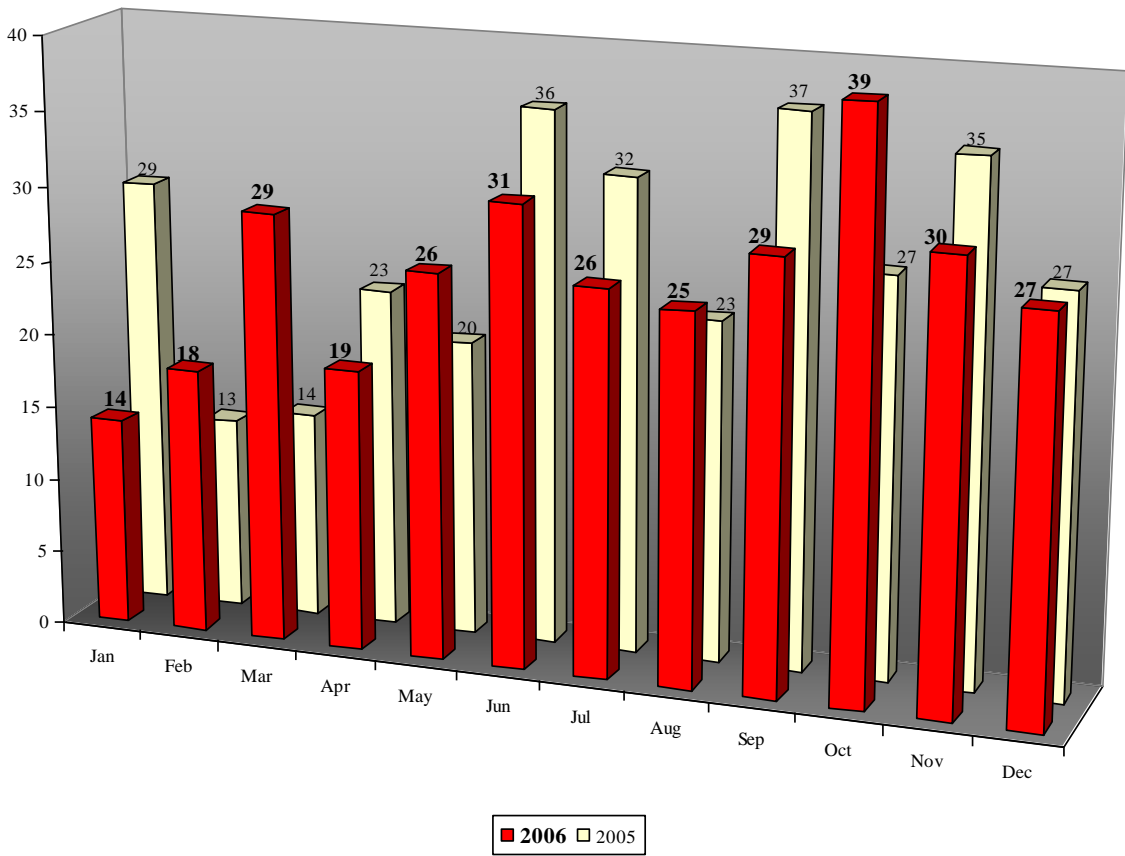

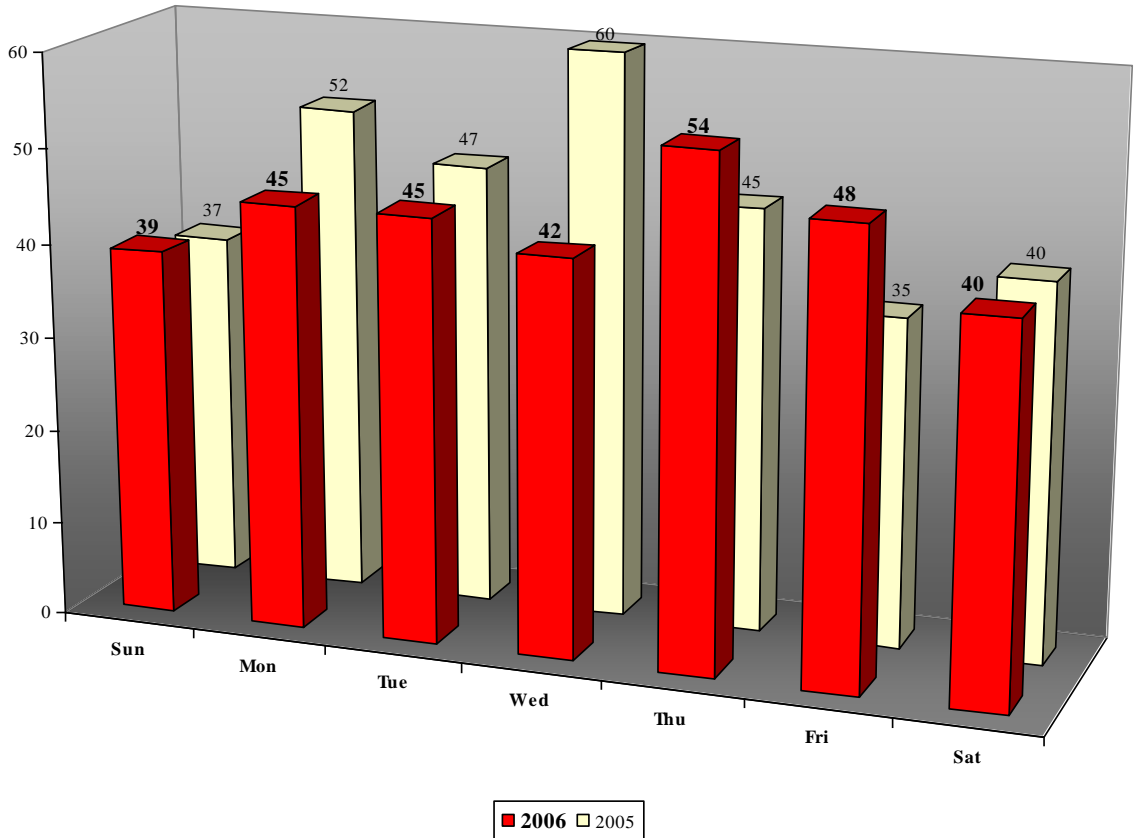

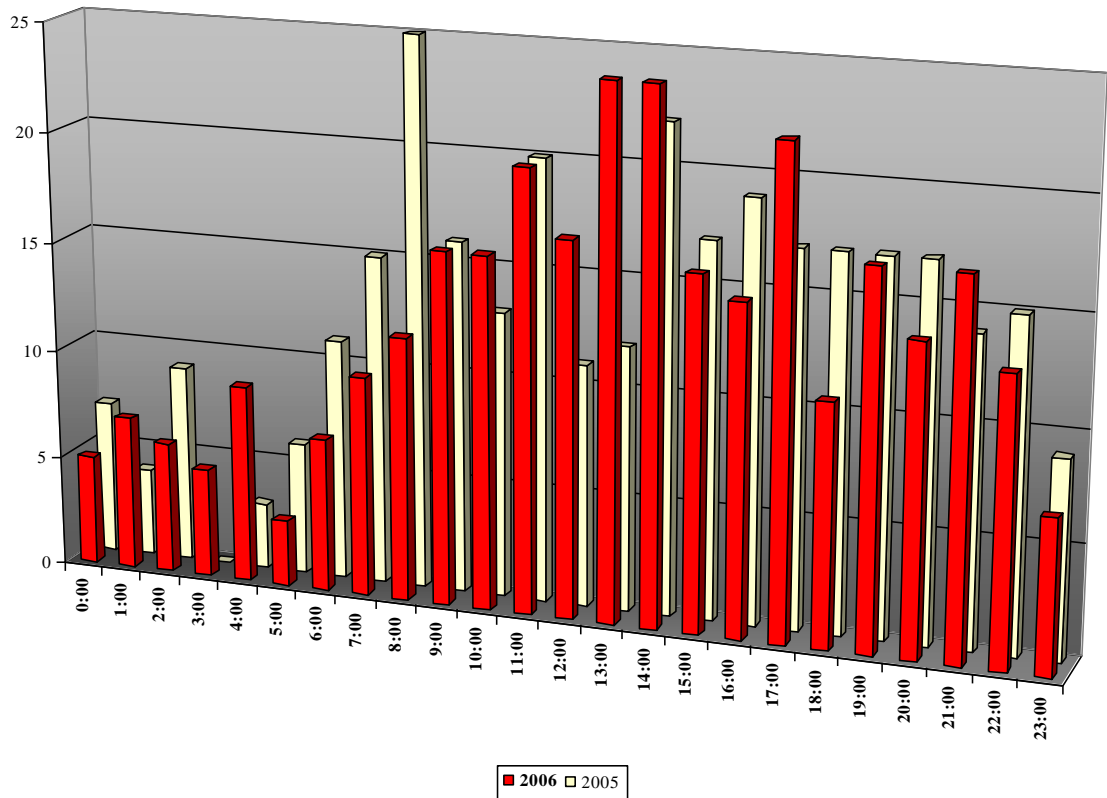
